We are looking for an inspirational leader to join our innovative, passionate and committed student services team and to coordinate our educational and support services for students with disabilities, providing the leadership to integrate this program into our efforts.

The College has a strong commitment to the achievement of equity and inclusion among its faculty, staff and students and values the rich diverse backgrounds that make up the campus community. In that spirit, we are seeking a candidate that has a profound understanding of and experience with successfully supporting individuals with varying backgrounds, which includes: persons with disabilities, various gender identities, sexual orientation, individuals from historically underrepresented communities and other groups to ensure the district provides an inclusive educational and employment environment focused on strategies for success and equitable outcomes for all.

The DSPS Coordinator reports to the Dean of Retention and Completion. Sample duties include:

- Coordination of program and services to meet federal, state and local requirements.
- Ensuring effective assessment, orientation, counseling, academic/career planning and educational programs and services are provided to students.
- Providing for diagnostic assessment of students with disabilities; determination of eligibility for support services; and provision of timely, specialized advisement to students with disabilities.
- Ensuring that personal, social and academic counseling services is afforded to DSP&S students.
- Monitoring student progress, persistence and retention.

Candidates must have a master's degree in Rehabilitation Counseling; candidates with master's degrees in Special Education Counseling, Guidance, Student Personnel, Psychology, Career Development, or Social Welfare *may* be eligible with specified additional coursework.

Starting salary is \$59,286 to \$79,449 depending on years of experience and education level. The District offers a very competitive benefits package, including health & welfare, income protection, and retirement through CalSTRS.
