

HOW DO WE SENSE AND PAY ATTENTION IN BLACK STUDIES?

Using "sense" as a throughline, this course will explore Black studies – as an intellectual and political project – across freedom and liberation movements (including abolition), visuality, music, the literary imagination, feminist and queer theater, and performance practices, protest, and geographies. Across this course, students will learn research methods to produce a final project such as an essay, curatorial project, or creative assignment.
