JSI COURSES & CURRICULUM

Scholars explore courses threaded together with relevant and timely cases of policy innovation happening in Washington state. At the end of the program, student present a mini-capstone team project on a current policy issue that draws on the skills acquired in their course work in policy analysis and implementation.

Course work includes:

- Economics for policy analysis
- Policy analysis, implementation & program evaluation
- Quantitative methods for policy making
- Leadership & community engagement
